**D. Reports, communications, appointments, and confirmations, from the mayor, directors, of departments, and another village matters:**

1. The discussion for a transmission line form Bowling Green is still being worked on with information coming soon.
2. The cost of the pumps for the downtown pump station being between \$8900.00 to \$13,000.00
3. Still working with Mr. Skaff on the sidewalk repaving and leveling program.
4. The smoke testing is complete, letters need to go out to those who need to make repairs.
5. The village was asked to sponsor a whole for Otsego Knights golf fundraiser.

**F. Village Administrator/Police Reported Colby Carroll reported on:**

1. The EPA Watershed Grant was applied for in the amount of \$75,000.00. Mr. Carroll is also looking into the Phase II Cyber Security Grant.
2. Working on the west side of the downtown sidewalks with Feller & Finch.
3. The AMI kick off meeting was held this week. A tentative timeline was set for weekly meeting with a June or July timeline of being complete.
4. There was a callout for the downtown pumpstation over the weekend. This pump was full of wipes, Mr. Haydel presented a picture of this clogged pump. Mr. Haydel will be ordering a new pump for the downtown pumpstation.
5. The Post Office had delivered the new turn style boxes. The post office maintenance will need to install these boxes.

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6. Still working with ODOT on installing the new speed signs for the STR64.

**G. Public Presentations and Hearings:** Dave Webster from Save the Bridge Committee updated council on the current status of this bridge. This committee is asking for a letter of support, the mayor already submitted this. This committee would like to place a banner in the downtown area across 64 attached. This was explained that ODOT would control this and what is allowed. Flyers were left for the downtown business to display in their windows if they wish. Mr. Webster feels the village would be a good choice to administer this bridge project or jointly join with the City of Waterville. Councilwoman Perry advised Mr. Webster to contact the Wood County Park district as they can may help and join with the Lucas County Park District. Haskins is not directly connected to the Roche De Bouf Bridge, feeling the Park Districts would be a better fit for this type of

**C. Streets and Utilities:** A committee meeting was held this evening before council to discuss road projects for the upcoming year. The village had pavement analysis done on village roads a few years ago. The road looking to be repaired on King, Greenwood with a quote need to repair Church and Main Street where the watermain break was this winter. Gary Haydel from WWTP presented a picture of the downtown pump station that went down over the weekend. This photo shows the pump being pulled and it clogged with a massive ball of wipes. These wipers are diaper, dude and perhaps Clorox wipes that are flushed down toilets causing the pump to fail and clog. The pumps were discussed a last month's council meeting though now it is imperative that the pump be ordered. **Wright moved Bonnough 2<sup>nd</sup> to allow Mr. Haydel to purchase 2 pumps for the WWTP that are similar to the pumps on King Road, all yes motion carried.**


**L Miscellaneous business (discussion of matter of general interest, communications, petitions and claims.**
